There are no mandatory subscriptions to the Computer Conservation Society, but it is customary to ask members for an annual voluntary donation of £15.

The aim of making the scheme voluntary remains twofold: to keep faith with those members who believe that subscriptions are against the spirit in which they joined the Society; and to avoid the administration load that would be incurred by any mandatory scheme.

Members have responded generously, and the Committee is grateful to the many individuals who have made a major contribution to meeting the Society's expenses. We receive occasional special donations for particular projects – such as the building of the replica of the Turing Bombe at Bletchley Park. We also benefit from a subvention from our parent organisation, the British Computer Society, but that is absorbed by their charges for administrative support and by the costs of producing and mailing the Society's journal *Resurrection*. However, it is the support of individual members which keeps the Society solvent.

We are now providing much more support for CCS working groups – in particular the Pegasus and Elliott 401 groups. The Science Museum is still generously supporting the direct costs such as repairs and maintenance of the air conditioning system, but the CCS will increasingly support the group's incidental costs – particularly travel.
