- Management & Technical committees
- Costs and fees
- Responsibilities and obligations
- IPR and benefits
- Confidentiality
- Admitting new sponsors
- Duration and termination
- Disputes



Coordinator

- Formerly Nortel
- Liaison between sponsors
- Admission of new sponsors
- Supervision of Project Management and Execution Agreement
 - auditing ANSA accounts
 - monitoring technology transfer
- Separate agenda item on this



Mgt Committee

- Establish core laboratory
- Direct finance, strategy, priorities
- Ownership and protection of results
- Approve work plan
- Appoint PD, CA, MC Chair, Coordinator
- Approve new sponsors
- Set exploitation dates, license fees
- Operational procedures



Technical Committee

- Forum for technical advice to MC
 - planning, priority, strategy, create work plan, appointment/replacement of Chief Architect
- Set requirements for ANSA
- Review and approve deliverables
- Identify opportunities for workshops



Costs and fees

- Fees set by MC
 - traditionally fees cover overheaded hours and travel
- Equipment by loan / donation
- Invoice monthly
 - Interest and termination of benefits if >60 days late
- Secondee rate set by MC



IPR and benefits

- Shared ownership
- MC sets release policy
- Licensing to third parties to be approved by MC
- Equal rights to exploitation
- No sponsor shall act in a manner to reduce the value of sponsorship to the others



Programme Mgt Agreement

- Scope of work
 - PD, CA
- Renumeration and terms of payment
- Reporting and accounts
 - independent audit
- Property and equipment
- IPR
 - APM discloses all results to sponsors
 - APM has right to licence, subject to MC approval
- Safeguarding IPR



More

- Secondments
 - reimbursement set by MC
- Liability
- Duration
- Termination
 - APM fails to meet obligations 60 days to recover
 - APM changes status
 - Sponsors and APM jointly agree
 - APM can "evict" a sponsor if supported by MC and coordinator

OMG

- In 1988 MC agreed ANSA should have a formal relationship with OMG
- Mike Eyre negotiated APM membership of OMG in return for Observer rights to OMG officers at ANSA TC
- Propose to continue with Richard Soley and Andrew Watson as nominated officers

Fujitsu

- Fujitsu has a contract with APM Ltd which ties
 FJ to the ANSA agreements "as if it were a sponsor"
- Countersigned by then coordinating sponsor
- MC at the time agreed because of difficulties for FJ in entering into open-ended collaboration
- MC minutes don't record the discussion or formal agreement
- BT has reservations that Fujitsu may not be on equal terms to other sponsors



Resolution

- Review concerns with BT
 - check rights and obligations of "standard" sponsors vis a vis Fujitsu
- Review issues with Fujitsu
 - investigate possibility of moving to standard agreement
- Proposal to next MC



Publication

- By default everything is consortium confidential
- CA has right to release for use in "standards"
- Has made ANSA invisible, but if we publish openly what's the benefit of sponsorship?
- No explicit patenting policy



Publication Proposal

- Code (and supporting documents) remain confidential for
 - 6 months
 - immediately available to ESPRIT partners on project use only license
 - then put in public domain, unless MC says otherwise
- Architectural Documents remain confidential for
 - 6 months
 - immediately available to ESPRIT partners
- Timely publication in technical journals
- Patents?
 - Who pays? Who benefits?
