I've just been looking through T.E.Ivall "Electronic Computers" (Ilfiffe 1956) & found a picture labelled "Digital computer, built by Decca, using magnetic-core devices for the arithmetic and control circuits" and a picture of a logic board. I've not heard of this before & I wonder if anyone knows if it ever operated?

I've read a bit about the Japanese "parametron" ferrite core/inductive devices used for logic & I believe the Russians developed a three state logic element based on a ferrite device, but I had not heard of a British one.

Can anyone suggest a source for material about this?
